My client is currently in protective custody at Krome and I have been assured he is in an appropriate placement to reduce COVID-19 risks as much as possible, the Immigration Court and the Office of the Chief Counsel and the Krome Detention Facility have been working together to make all tech arrangements for Monday, and I continue to have direct access to my client for the purpose of private calls.
I additionally would like to reiterate my request that Mr. be returned to the Krome Behavioral Health Unit and not moved to any facility in light of COVID-19 concerns. My client has several underlying medical and mental health conditions that makes him particularly vulnerable to developing a serious COVID-19 infection, and the safest thing for his health right now is for him to be at the Behavioral Health Unit where he can best receive treatment.
However, at a minimum, I would like assurance that he will not be moved until his individual hearing is completed. I believe that given these extraordinary circumstances we are all living through, delay of my client's transfer is warranted.

Good Afternoon Officers,

I have very much appreciated the ability to keep in good contact with my client during the time he has been at Krome. It has been extremely helpful as we move towards resolution of his case and on several occasions he has expressed his appreciation for the mental health care he is now receiving. However, I am now writing with serious concerns about his medical and physical health.

## I REQUEST THAT MR. NOT BE TRANSFERRED FROM KROME TO ANY OTHER IMMIGRATION DETENTION FACILITY UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

I am writing to ask that he NOT be removed from Krome and returned to Farmville or elsewhere due to the alarming outbreak of COVID-19 this week at Farmville. From June 16 until today, the number of cases at Farmville has risen from 11 to 50 confirmed cases according to ICE statistics, and I anticipate this number to increase significantly as new testing is completed.

Mr. has several underlying medical and mental health conditions which put him at particular vulnerability for a particularly serious COVID-19 infection, and a transfer at this time may be very harmful to his health.

Additionally, Mr. has been detained since 2019, and on 2019, and on 2010, he has his final individual asylum hearing scheduled. If he were to be moved from Krome now, it is almost certain that his individual asylum hearing would have to be postponed, as he might, in the best circumstances, be subject to a quarantine that would impact his ability to appear and to prepare for his trial with me. As a reminder, I serve as a Qualified Representative for Mr. because he has been incompetent to stand trial by an immigration judge under Matter of M-A-M-.

## I REQUEST THAT MR. BE GIVEN THE CLOTHING HE NEEDS TO NOT BE COLD AND TRANSFERRED BACK TO THE KROME BEHAVIORAL HEALTH UNIT

Second, I am writing to request reasonable accommodations so that can continue to participate in the behavioral health program. However, he informed me that he is often extremely cold in this part of the facility and that this is causing significant pain in his bones such that it makes it hard for him to participate in the classes and sessions of the program. He believes that if he has full access to his heavier jackets and his sweatshirts and an additional blanket, he can fully participate in the program and would very much like to do so. He informed me that he has been prevented by facility staff from having adequate clothing to protect him from the cold (which causes unusual pain due to his physical disabilities).

He informed me that he was discharged from the behavioral health unit into the regular population of Krome and no longer has access to the same mental health resources as a result. He would like to be transferred back, and to have access to proper clothing and blankets so that he can continue to participate in this program. I believe that ensuring this small accommodation would be the best resolution to this problem.
